
ADULT COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES

What is the Community Support Program (CSP)?

The Community Support Program aims to assist in the recovery of individuals who have been diagnosed with a chronic mental illness. This program has been very successful with assisting clients in achieving a better quality of life, through treatment services that are recovery-focused, person-centered, and community-based.

Who is eligible for services?

- St. Croix County Residents
- Individuals diagnosed with mental illness or a co-occurring substance use disorder
- Interested individuals must meet with a Clinical Coordinator to discuss their needs and complete the functional screening process



Services Provided

Individuals entering the Community Support Program are assigned a Case Manager, who will partner with them to complete a comprehensive assessment and develop a recovery plan with the individual. The case manager also provides support, outreach, and coordination with other treatment providers. Services provided within CSP include:

- Psychiatric Services
- Coordinated Service Teams
- Medication prescription, administration, monitoring, and education
- Case Management
- Symptom Management
- Crisis Intervention
- Social and recreational skill development
- Coordination of referrals to other service providers i.e. mental health therapy and substance use and

Assistance with:

- Locating, obtaining, and maintaining stable housing
- Education or employment goals
- Learning and accomplishing skills needed to function independently, such as food preparation, grooming and hygiene, housekeeping, and shopping
- Applying for appropriate benefits
- Establishing in primary care providers (ex: medical, dental, vision)



What is Targeted Case Management (TCM)?

Targeted Case Management services aim to assist and support individuals with access and referral to necessary medical, educational, vocational, social, and other basic needs.

Services Provided

Individuals living with mental illness entering the Targeted Case Management Program are assigned a Behavioral Health Technician, who will partner with them to complete a comprehensive assessment and develop a recovery plan with the individual.

Services provided within TCM include:

- Information
- Referral
- Resource
